

Important Information about Dress Code for 2009-2010

- ◆ Students' non compliance with the dress code will be handled in the following manner: Students will be sent to the office and provided with appropriate "loaner" clothing to include khaki drawstring pants or wrap-around skirts and collared shirts. Loaner clothing must be returned to the office at the end of the day at which time the student's inappropriate clothing will be returned.
- ◆ In cooler weather, only Seacrest logo long sleeve shirts may be worn. Non-Seacrest long sleeve shirts may not be worn under short sleeve shirts. If sweaters or sweatshirts are worn, they must be Seacrest School logo'd or **absolutely plain**. High School students may also wear college sweaters or sweatshirts. Again, "loaner" Seacrest sweatshirts will be available if a student is wearing a non-dress code item.
- ◆ P.E. clothing will NOT be available for sale during the school day; clothing will be for sale at Seacrest Outfitters *only* before and after school. Students without the proper P.E. uniform will be given the use of a "loaner" uniform by the P.E. Department.
- ◆ "Croc's" are not to be worn to school. Students need to wear acceptable footwear to participate in physical education or on the playgrounds.
- ◆ Jewelry must be conservative in size, design, and amount. Only studs and small hoop earrings are permitted; *no* dangles.
- ◆ No makeup may be worn in the elementary grades. Students in grades 6 through 12 may use a minimal amount of conservative makeup.
- ◆ Hair must be off-the-collar for boys; boys with hair longer than the collar must have their hair pulled back in an unadorned ponytail; for both boys and girls, bangs may not be below the eyebrows. Haircuts and color must be conservative and deemed appropriate by the school.
- ◆ Belts: If belts are worn, they must be plain, unadorned, and secured with a buckle. Chains are not permitted.
- ◆ The school reserves the right to prohibit any item of dress or accessory that is deemed inappropriate.
